The Valedictory session was organised in the evening where Ms. Dolly Chanana addressed the gathering and congratulated the winning schools.

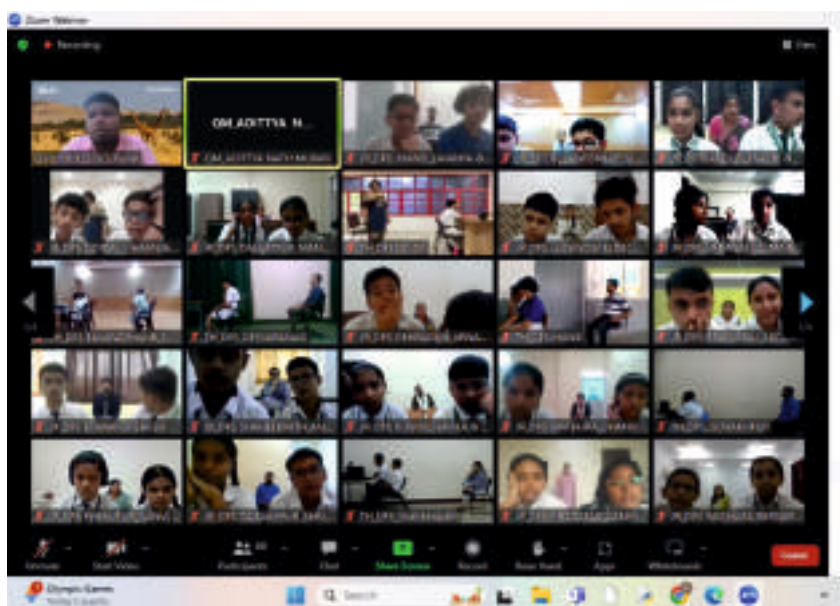
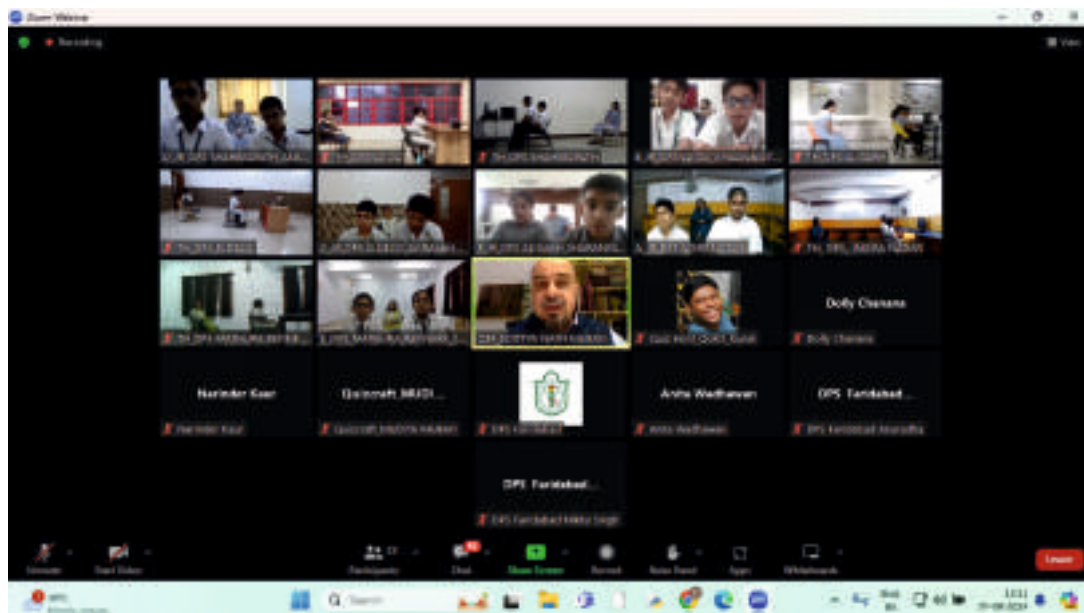

The workshops strengthened teachers' skills in framing quality assessments to enhance student learning outcomes.



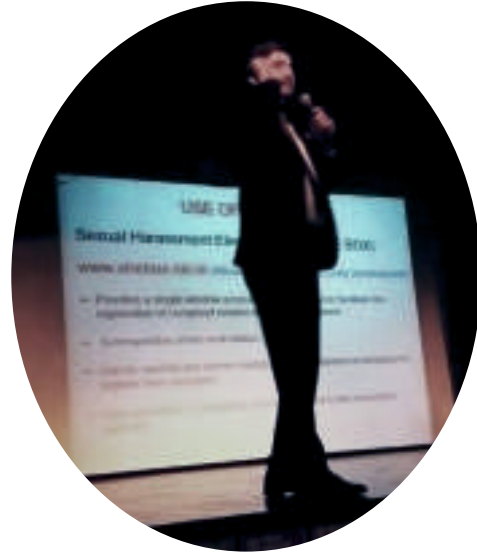

Life Skills and Mental Health

The modern world is full of uncertainty and complexity. DPS Faridabad understands that when children grow in this VUCA (Volatility, Uncertainty, Complexity, Ambiguity) world, they are bound to be scared, confused and make choices that might not always be right. We understand the responsibility of raising children in such testing times where even the home environment might not offer the sense of security and belongingness. We also know that the onus of the teacher has increased. The message that it's okay to not be okay, has to reach out to each child in our care. What is more important is, that we have the courage to ask for help when in need, keeping in mind that mental health is a journey and not a destination.

Inclusive Practices: Inclusion, at school, is more than just a principle — it is a promise we live by every day. Rooted in the belief that “no child should be left behind”, the 3H³ (Head, Heart and Hand Initiative) strives to ensure that every learner, regardless of ability, is empowered to reach his / her full potential.

At school, we follow the three pronged approach of Screening, Observation, Parent Collaboration. Individualized Intervention, Social–Emotional Learning, Visual Scaffolding, Peer Learning, Group Discussions and Adaptive Learning are a few of the many techniques used to help learners understand and grow. With a strong foundation of teamwork, empathy, and evidence-based interventions,

possibilities turn into progress, moving ahead to create bridges for deeper understanding, acceptance, and growth.

As we move ahead, our goal remains unwavering-to create a learning environment where differences are not barriers, but bridges to deeper understanding, acceptance, and growth and richness of diversity.

Individual Counselling

The School Counselling Department continues to provide emotional, behavioural, and academic support to students throughout the academic year. The primary focus remains on fostering emotional well-being, improving coping skills, enhancing classroom adjustment, and promoting a positive school climate. The counsellors use the following:

- Student self-assessment forms and emotional check-ins
- Behavioural observation sheets

- Teacher feedback forms
- Socio-emotional screening tools
- Classroom behaviour rating scales
- Reflection worksheets and mood trackers

Regular Life Skills sessions are conducted in all the classes. In the primary and the middle wing, Story Telling sessions are used to nurture core values among the students. The students imbibe values without the usual didactic sermons from elders.

World Mental Health Day was celebrated in the school in October. Various activities like a mental wellness exhibition, framing wellbeing quotes from the given set of words, flower decoration based on emotions, filling the gratitude jar, and many more were organised during the week to raise awareness regarding the importance of reaching out when one felt low or dejected.

Career Counselling

The Career Counselling & International Admissions Department helps students navigate a global academic world by mixing counselling with practical experiences. In the 2024–25 year DPS Faridabad’s Career Counselling &

International Admissions team delivered real, hands-on opportunities. Through international trips internships fairs and expert talks students learned about global education — they lived it. These experiences equipped them to make smart choices and move forward with confidence.

Global Education Fair – May 18, 2024

Universities from the UK, US, Canada, Australia, Japan, France, Germany, Italy, Ireland, Switzerland and New Zealand visited DPS Faridabad. Ms. Dolly Chanana, Joint Director of the DPS Society, opened the event. Ms. Ambika Kaul, Prof. Saikat Majumdar

and Mr. Swagat Yadav spoke about summer plans and how to plan academics and careers across fields. Students met representatives, learned about courses and scholarships and clarified their global options.



Visit to Ashoka University – May 28, 2024

A group of 17 students and 12 teachers toured Ashoka University. Student ambassadors took them around hostels, academic areas, common spaces and

the Centre for Well-Being. The group learned about the University’s curriculum, admission process, scholarships and student life.

SPACE OBSERVATORY AND RESEARCH

The Universe for All astronomy programme at DPS Faridabad enriched students of Classes I–XII through star parties, observatory sessions and hands-on space science activities, nurturing curiosity and scientific inquiry.

A major highlight was the celebration of National Space Day on August 23, 2024, when students, mentored by the SOAR Centre team, acted as young science communicators, guiding visitors through telescopic observations of Venus, Saturn, Jupiter and the Andromeda Galaxy, and explaining celestial events. Throughout the year, students engaged in constellation identification, star charting, rocketry, light experiments, astrophotography and advanced telescope handling, using Stellarium and Celestron PWI software.

A series of evening observation sessions held between October 2024 and March 2025 enabled students to explore constellations, practise sky navigation and capture images of the Moon, planets and deep-sky objects like the Orion Nebula. Another

landmark event was the Planet Parade at the SOAR Centre (January 24–February 2, 2025), which drew over 800 participants and featured telescopic observations, interactive exhibits and a virtual session titled Colourful Cosmos.

In March 2025, students of Classes VI–X participated in a star party trip to Jaipur, combining planet and deep-sky observations with a visit to JantarMantar. The programme concluded with the Universe for All 2024–25 Graduation Ceremony, where Principal Ms. Sangeeta Chakravarty and Vice Principal Dr. Sandipan Rishi lauded the students' enthusiasm and perseverance. The collaboration between DPS Faridabad and SPACE India successfully transformed stargazing into experiential STEM learning, inspiring young minds to keep reaching for the stars.

“What is something important about which nearly everybody is wrong?”

Countries: Incredibly Flawless or Incredibly Flawed?

How the Textbook Politicisation of Countries proves to be Humanity’s Continuous Downfall Time and Again

Thomas Mann once said, “Time has no divisions to mark its passage, there is never a thunderstorm or blare of trumpets to mark the beginning of a new month or year. Even when a new century begins, it is only we mortals who ring bells or fire off pistols.” I have often found myself pouring over these words. Much like time itself, the territorial boundaries we've forged are not 'natural'; they are mortal, human relations.

Nation states as we now know them, did not exist for the majority of human history. Territories were ruled by powerful locals, who swore loyalty to distant authority. The obstacles which arose due to this system eventually led to the Thirty Years' War, which resulted in a comprehensive rethinking of the relationship between people and their power over land. The concepts of sovereignty and territorial integrity were introduced. Kings and queens had 'their' people and related land; they were not entitled to intervene beyond their own thresholds. I do not disagree with the fact that leaders bring organisation to a world which would be hard to survive without order and logic. However, that is no excuse for the territorial, racial and political conflicts which leave mass death and destruction in their wake.

Hence, I find it quite ironic that we use the word ‘humanity’ to describe morality and ethical inclination, when humans themselves, are the ones who choose to follow a certain instinct to conflict. A myriad of us figuratively, seem to have a deep-rooted programming in our brains, as if we are machines. It states; quite forthrightly, whatever we find beyond our imaginary borders is what we must destroy, unless we can somehow exploit or benefit from it. When thought about and contemplated, this ideology proves to be somewhat illogical and awkward. When are we going to realise that we just built it ourselves, hiding behind the ideas of organisation and administration? How is that reasonable, when we all are the same in the end; we all are human, we all arise from the same species and we all currently dwell on this earth at the same time.

In the words of Rusty Schweikhart, a member of the 1969 Apollo 9 space mission, “You look down there and you can’t imagine how many borders and boundaries you cross, again and again and again, and you don’t even see them.” What we need is a change in perspective; to look at this earth as something of a miracle, something we all ought to share, and yet, we think of ourselves as the sovereigns of this vast, unknown world which we know we will never fully comprehend. Each and every one of us descends from the same ancestors. What then is the explanation for nationalism? Why do people face racism and stereotypes due to their racial and ethnic groups over which they have little to no control? It is patent that many groupings are useful for structure and the pursuit of different faiths, but that yet again, does not elucidate why various countries feel the need to use them in order to vie against one another for authority and power in this error-stricken world.

The youth today participate in Model United Nation conferences but are the delegates of major countries so similar to students? Frankly, MUNs help students like myself view just how futile international dialogue can often be. In theory, supranational

organisations like the UNO hold power and solidarity. But in practice, it is the nationalised hegemony of individual superpowers that rules over the world. The best example of this is the series of catastrophic earthquakes in Syria and Turkey 3 years ago. While Turkey got aid within days, the UN failed to provide the suffering Syrian peoples with any effective aid until two weeks after the worst earthquake of the century. Why was that? Because the Security Council, dominated of course by its five permanent members, refused to take appropriate action and used the country's vulnerability as political leverage. I ask you, who suffered the most in the end? It was the people, our fellow brothers and sisters, in poor Syrian villages worst hit by the earthquake, on top of the rampage of terrorism from which Syria already suffers.

The truth states that the world is dissected into its most powerful, developed giants, which; at the time, are the United States and China. Whichever countries these may be, they are opposite poles, always fighting for the upper hand which in turn, ensures that developing and less powerful countries do not get a say in our eternal longing for world peace and unity. In those moments, no location is safe from horror because, like people, communities are complex amalgams of high ideals and animal instincts that are capable of admiration, resentment, love, and hatred at the same time.

What the philosophies of Plato and Thomas Hobbes have in common is their belief that most politicians fight only for personal gain. Ideas of self-preservation drive our activities and deeds. This notion; though thoroughly discussed centuries before us, is easily relatable to the modern world where our shared borders decide our actions for us. Are there not some who call their siblings ‘third-world countries’? Essentially, how suitable can a Cold War-era categorization be when used to describe economic, political, and social life in Africa, Asia, and Latin America?

Does not it seem particularly apathetic? In these times when the world should put emphasis on green transition and the protection of human rights, we frankly do not have time for wars and eternal conflict. Reading and hearing about such global issues so regularly is a bitter experience but a good teacher. I refuse to believe that all humans are destined wholly, to be selfish and irrefutably so.

I agree with John Locke’s political philosophy which simply explicated his belief that every person ought to be able to hold certain rights for instance, the right to life, liberty and property. As we all know, these are universal aspects, and they never should fall prey to societal rules and regulations. John Locke was one of those bright thinkers of his time who thought out loud, without fear, and whose thoughts live on to this day and age. We have a simple choice, to either be the culprits of our own ruin, or be the shining beacons of hope biding true to our rights and values.

In spite of everything, Churchill did once wisely state, “To improve is to change. To be perfect is to change often.” We must not lose hope. The world evolves. The world moves on. That is reality and we will keep revelling in it forever and a day.

Abbaye du Mont - Saint - Michel - Normandie

En 1979, l'UNESCO inscrit le Mont Saint-Michel et sa baie sur la liste du Patrimoine Mondial de l'Humanité.

Le mont Saint-Michel, dès qu'on le voit pour la première fois, suscite une impression extraordinaire : pour certains, c'est monstrueux ; pour tous, c'est étrange. Ces quelques mots, tirés du guide descriptif du mont Saint-Michel de M. Edouard le Héricher, expriment parfaitement la sensation ressentie lorsqu'on découvre ce rocher qui surgit des flots. En effet, le mont Saint-Michel a tous les éléments pour provoquer des émotions singulières ; il allie la grandeur du site à la poésie des légendes.

Le Mont-Saint-Michel s'élève au milieu d'une vaste baie soumise aux plus grandes marées d'Europe. C'est un site exceptionnellement célèbre à explorer avec passion ! Des visites guidées de l'Abbaye sont prévues pour les enfants de 7 à 12 ans, ainsi que des promenades ludiques de découverte dans la baie.

Le Mont Saint-Michel était initialement appelé Mont Tombe en raison de son rocher granitique. En 708, l'archange Michel apparaît en rêve à saint Aubert, évêque d'Avranches, et lui demande de construire un sanctuaire en son honneur. En 966, une communauté de moines bénédictins s'installe et fait ériger une première église. Parallèlement, un village commence à se développer en contrebas pour accueillir les premiers pèlerins.

Le site a miraculeusement été épargné pendant la Seconde Guerre mondiale. Malgré cela, les Allemands l'ont occupé de 1940 à 1944.

En 1966, on célèbre le millénaire de la fondation de l'abbaye et le retour d'une communauté religieuse. Depuis 2001, les frères et sœurs des Fraternités Monastiques de Jérusalem assurent une présence spirituelle permanente et accueillent des pèlerins et des visiteurs du monde entier.

Entre 2006 et 2015, un chantier hors-norme a permis de réinventer l'accès au site afin de faire face à l'ensablement progressif de la baie et de préserver le caractère maritime du Mont Saint-Michel. Les parkings ont été réaménagés sur le continent, l'ancienne digue-route a été détruite au profit d'un pont-passerelle, et un barrage a été construit sur le Couesnon pour repousser les sédiments.

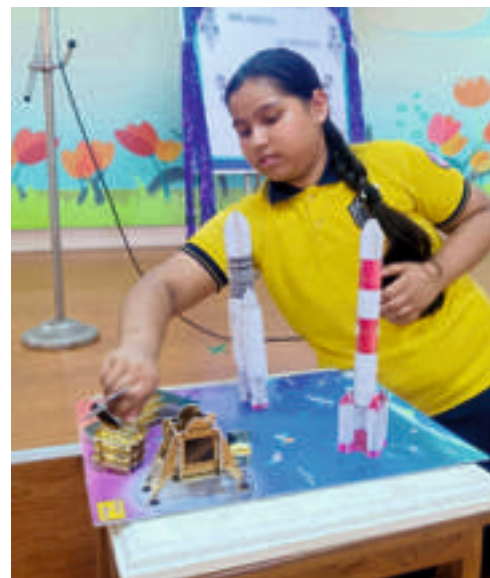
INDEPENDENCE DAY

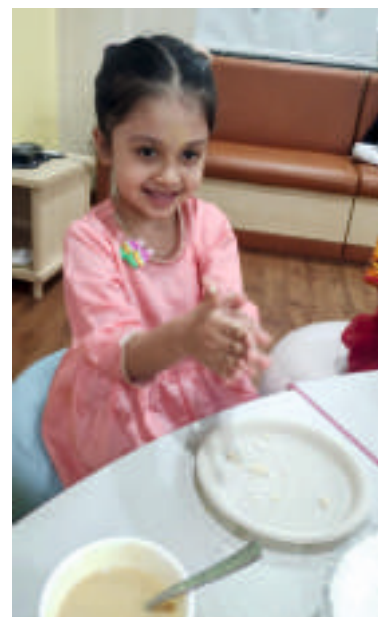
NATIONAL SPACE DAY

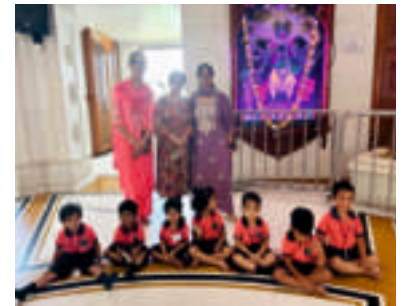
HAAT OF ART

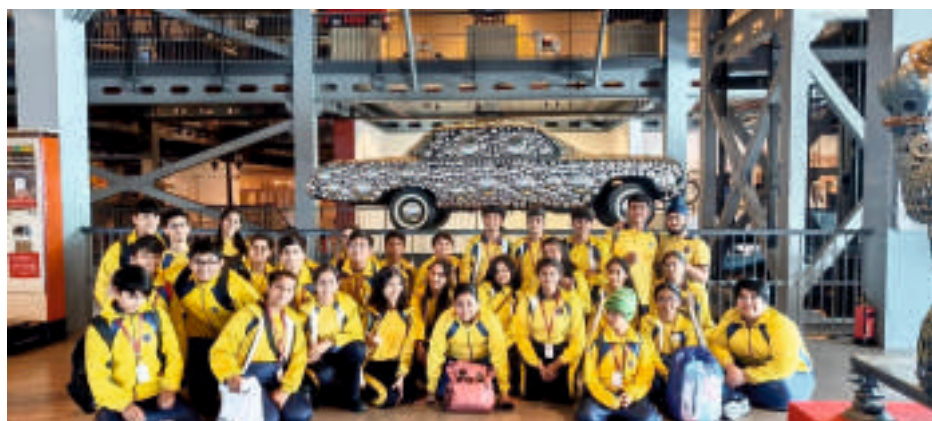
HYDERABAD

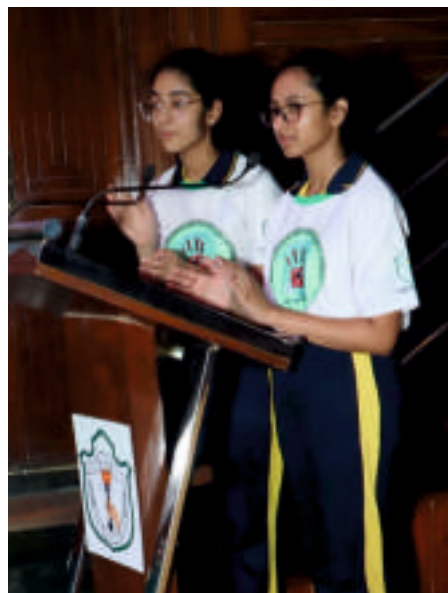
SCHOOL CLUBS

Depths Of The Ocean

Ever wondered where the oceans end? Or how their depths are never fully discovered? Well, here in this article, let us dive deeper into this topic! The depths of the oceans are really scary to explore, especially when you don't know what terrifying creatures might be waiting for you.

Many podcasts claim that scuba divers have seen real—yes, REAL—mermaids in the sea. But no, they're not the fancy fairy-tale ones... they looked creepy, almost like monsters. One scuba diver's podcast was taken down because it affected children. However, one line became really famous on YouTube: “Now mermaids are not as they are in fairy tales; they're dark creatures.”

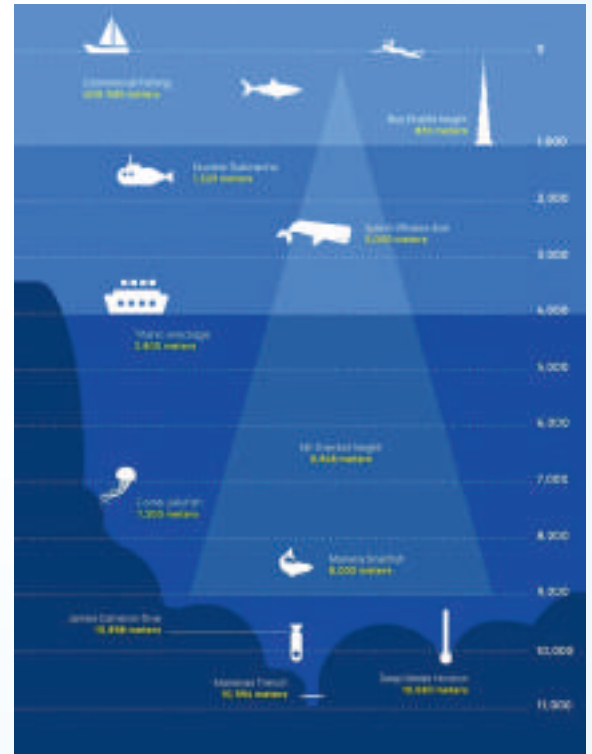
Believe it or not, the pressure at the deepest parts of the ocean is immense, meaning it can instantly kill an unprotected human. At the deepest point, the Challenger Deep in the Mariana Trench, the pressure is over 1,100 times greater than at the surface—enough to instantly crush a human and even annihilate a submarine. The pressure increases rapidly as you go down; every 10 meters you descend, the pressure rises by 1 atmosphere. At an average depth of 3,800 meters, the pressure is about 380 times greater than at the surface!

Beyond approximately 800 meters (2,600 feet), almost no sunlight penetrates, creating total darkness, where light only comes from bioluminescent creatures—those that produce their own light.

And guess what? Despite the freezing temperature of 4°C, there are hydrothermal vents on the ocean floor. Hydrothermal vents are small openings that release boiling hot water (over 600°F).

There is also a hidden, alien-like life! The oceans are home to many terrifying and bizarre creatures. For example, the tongue-eating louse, *Cymothoa Exigua*, enters a fish's gills, attaches to its tongue, and consumes its blood supply. The fish's tongue withers away, and the parasite becomes the fish's new tongue.

Over 80% of the oceans remain unexplored, with the deepest parts being the least mapped and least understood regions on Earth.

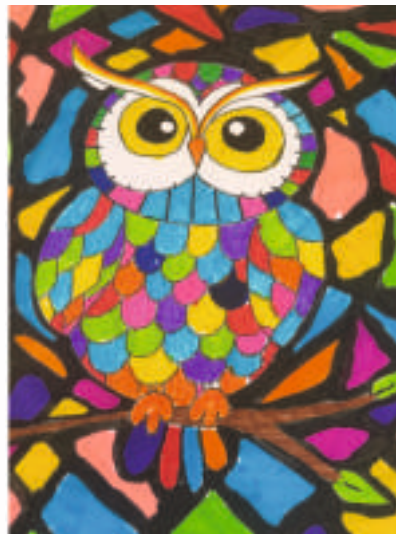

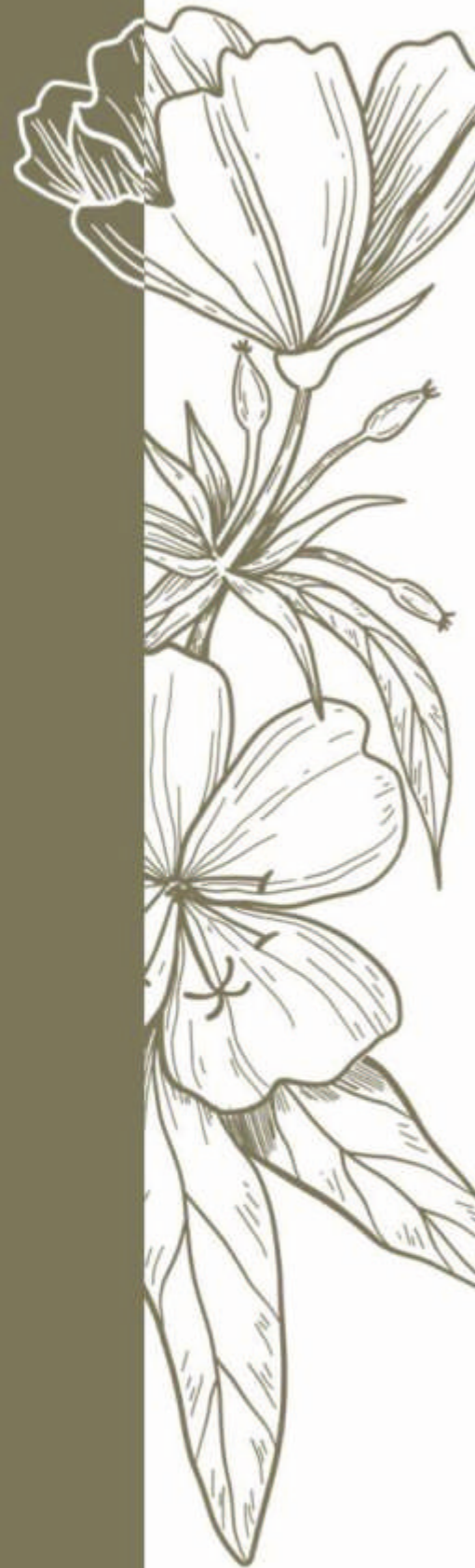

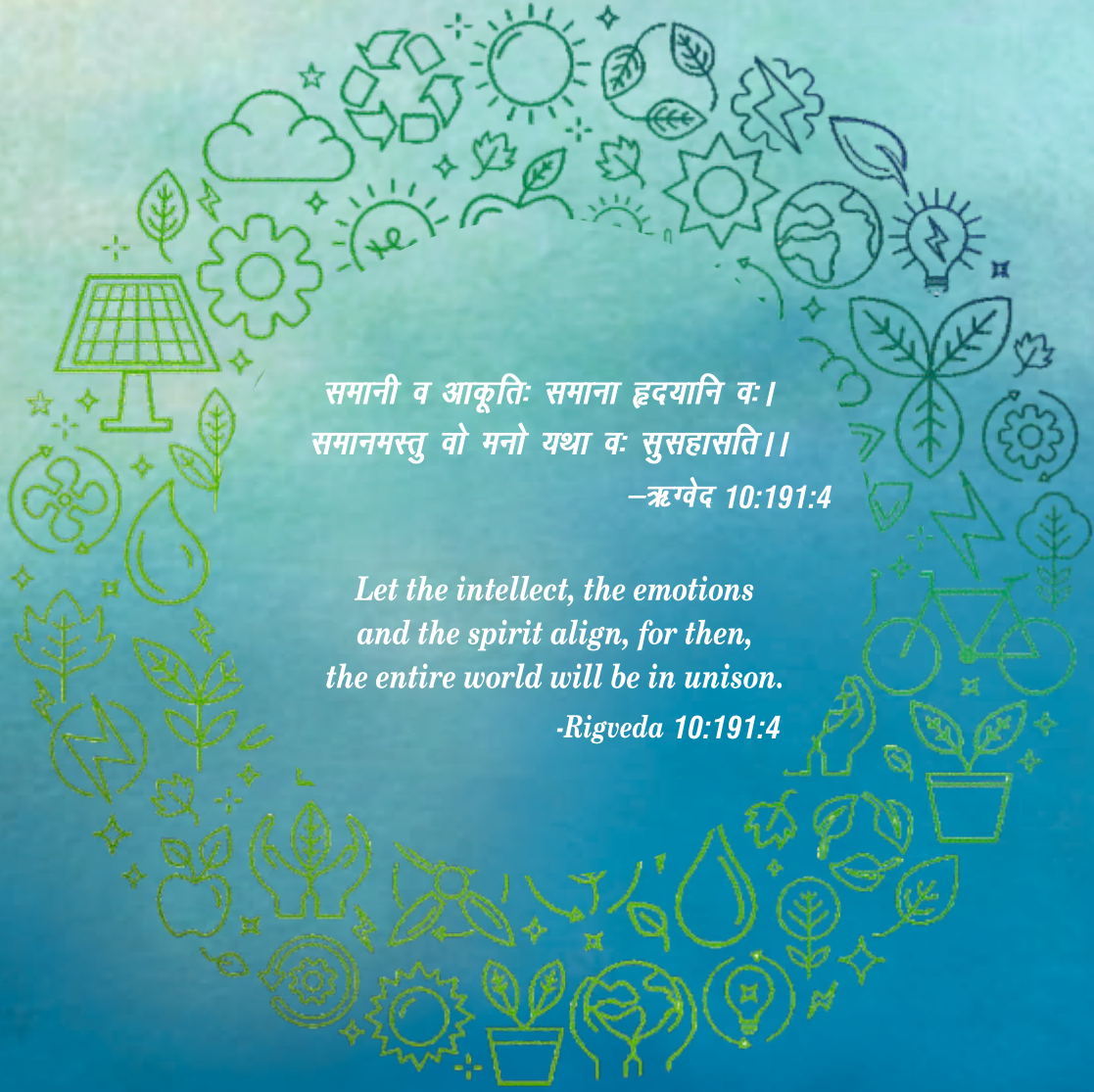
